<b>10 Max</b>	<p><b>5:</b> Large obstacles that have been overcome Strong reason for why to be a pilot Sense of selflessness Strong desire to serve Already taken some sort of steps to move toward being a pilot.</p>	<p><b>4:</b> Letters are from Active Duty Officers or civilian equivalents such as airline pilots or civic leaders. Letters show a clear sense of proven initiative and potential to become a successful pilot. Strongly desired: community involvement in areas which benefit others as well as dedication to aviation.</p>	<p><b>1:</b> Overall well organized with some minor flaws. Most grammar and spelling are good for their age group. All application criteria followed precisely to include word count.</p>
	<p><b>4:</b> Challenges that are still above average for their age group and have been overcome or working towards overcoming.</p>	<p><b>3:</b> Letters from somewhat influential people who still have a strong ability to judge character. Show a history of good ethics and future potential.</p>	<p><b>0.75:</b> Mostly well organized. Some grammar and spelling that detracts from readability but not overall message. Word count 15-40 words over/under.</p>
<b>6 Min</b>	<p><b>3:</b> Wants to be a pilot mainly for fun reasons or lacks a strong sense of purpose. Lacks a sense of purpose to serve in military or civilian aviation industry.</p>	<p><b>2:</b> Letters are short and/or not from military or community leaders</p>	<p><b>0.5:</b> Not well organized or significant amount of spelling/grammar errors for their age group. Word count &gt;40 words over/under.</p>
